President's Badge

Awarded during year 4, a young person would:

- **Complete a Christian faith development course**
 - **Have good attendance for 1 session**
 - **Be recommended by the Company Captain**
 - **Participate in a non-residential teamwork skills experience run by Battalion, District or Region**
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- **Completed at least 30 points from the Discover programme, having gained three badges in the last 12 months**
 - **Taken part in an activity based residential event within the BB**
 - **Complete 10 hours of practical service for the Brigade or church**





Regulations for The Queen's Badge

To gain The Queen's Badge a young person must:

- **Hold the President's Badge.**
- **Attend a Queen's Badge Candidate's Meeting.**
- **Participate in skills-based training.**
- **Take Responsibility within the Brigade or Church.**
- **Provide Voluntary Service or Support to others outside the Brigade and Church.**
- **Develop Interests - undertake at least two activities from Skills, Physical and Expedition/Exploration.**
- **Participate in a Completion Residential.**
- **Record Activity.**





Key Dates

- **The date of registration – stamped in the front of the book by Rathmore.**
- **The date of completion of Skills Based Training – as there must be at least 6 months from the end of Training until the Residential Course.**





Role of Advisor

- To meet with young man, discuss plan and sign it off.
- To be available for issues during the work for the award.
- To set targets with the young person.
- To maintain the integrity of the award.
- To read the completed book and sign off the Authorisation Page.
- To discuss with companies how best to progress the award.





Role of Company Mentor

- **To understand the award.**
- **To assist in the formulation of The Action Plan** (Not to see this as a Production Line!)
- **To work with the young man so they get the best from it.**
- **To support and encourage on a week-by-week basis.**





Role of The Potential Queen'sman

- To read the book!
- To be involved in the Action Plan – knowing what they have committed to do.
- To organise themselves.
- To get out of their comfort zone.
- To feel a real sense of achievement at the completion of the award.
